

## JND382 – Small Circles - by John Lockwood



Instructions by June Smith

John has created a 'You Tube Video' dated 14<sup>th</sup> February 2024, using the new JND382 Small Circles Die set, where he demonstrates how to make a card. I would advise that you visit it as well as following these instructions.



### Information:

This die set has been designed to match and work with the JND Layering dies 2023 (JND351 6" – JND352 5" & JND353 4" Layering Dies. So, in this set you have the following:

- 1) Circle Scalloped Edge 3½"
- 2) Plain Circle 3"
- 3) Dotted Circle 2¾"
- 4) Circle Scalloped Edge 2½"
- 5) Plain Circle 2"
- 6) Dotted Circle 1¾"
- 7) Circle Scalloped Edge 1½"
- 8) Circle Square 1"
- 9) Dotted Circle ¾"

### Materials

4" x 4" White Top Folding Card Blank  
JND382 Small Circles Die Set (9)  
JND442 Modern Sentiments Stamp Set  
JND434 Daisy Circle & Leaves Die Set (2)  
Essential Coconut White Card  
Press to Impress Stamping Platform  
Versafine Smokey Grey Ink

A5 Die Cutting Machine

Glue Glaze

Clear Dew Drops

2mm Foam Tape

Craft Kit

### Method:

- Bring in die 3 which is the largest dotted circle and die 5 the plain circle, then using a long piece of pink repositionable tape, pick up the inside circle and hover over the outside dotted circle until it is in the middle, press down both ends of the strip, you can then use the ends as a handle to pick up both dies together and place near the bottom right-hand corner of the card, press down the handles and run this through your die cutting machine. You then have a beautiful dotted circle on your card.
- We then need to make a frame for the circle, so we use the same die no 5, pick up with the pink tape and this time add it over the die no 4 which is the circle scalloped edge die, add this onto a piece of white card, press down the tape ends and run through your die cutting machine. You then have this beautiful scalloped circle below.
- Before we add the frame onto the top of the design we want to add a sentiment inside the circle, so that it shows through when you close the card up. To do this we need our stamping platform, add the folded card into the top left-hand corner, add at least 4 magnets onto the corners to secure it. Place the chosen sentiment face down into the circle, close the lid to pick it up, ink it with Versafine Smokey Grey ink pad, close the lid and use your stamping tool to press down onto the stamp, then when you open the lid you can see the beautiful sentiment through the circle. We can then add the circle frame into place using glue glaze.



- We need to secure the card closed with low tack tape at the bottom, and then use glue glaze to add 2 of the leaves and a daisy flower with a clear dew drop in the middle (these have been left over from a previous project) around the bottom of the circle. These are flat mounted so no foam tape at all.

This type of card can be made into wedding or party invitations, or even just a card to send to someone special to say thinking of you. Such a great idea.
