

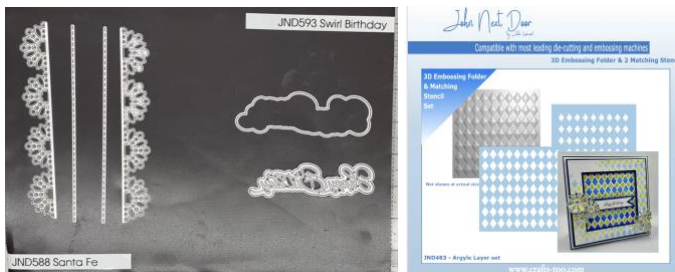
## Pink Embossed Edger Card using JND588 & JND593 - by John Lockwood



Instructions by June Smith

John has created a 'You Tube Video' dated 10th April 2026, using JND593 Swirl Birthday die set and JND588 Santa Fe die set, where he demonstrates how to make this beautiful clean and classic card above. It is absolutely perfect for any occasion at all, so it is very versatile. I would advise that you visit it as well as following these instructions.

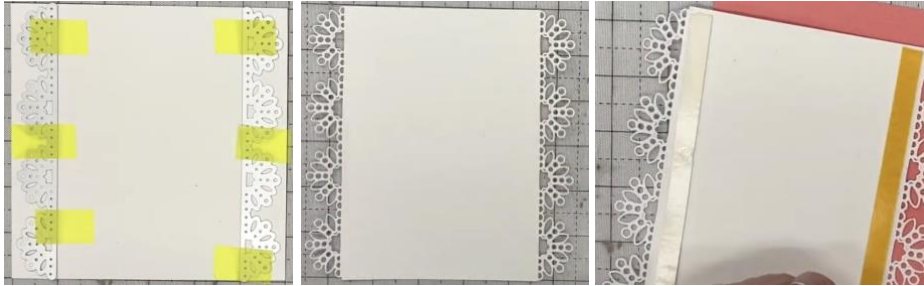
### Materials:

7" x 7" Top Folding Card Blank  
JND593 Swirl Birthday Die (2)  
JND588 Santa Fe Die set (4)  
JND483 Argyle Embossing Folder  
Essential Coconut White Card  
Canvas Card – Soft Pink range in 3 different Pinks  
3M Craft Mount Spray Adhesive  
Die Cutting Machine  
Craft Kit

### Method:

- Take a piece of Coconut White card cut to 6" x 6" and lay this evenly onto your multi-media mat. We are going to be using the 2 detailed dies from the

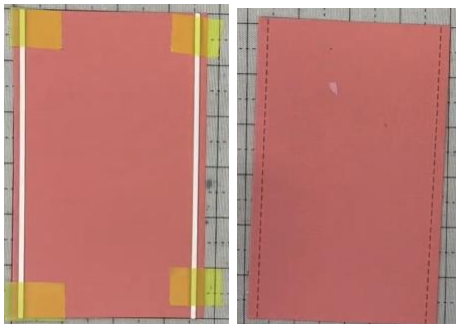
Sana Fe die set next, so using your multi-media mat place one of the detailed dies down the left hand side at the 1" mark on your mat, the tips of both ends are just very slightly hanging over the edges of the card top and bottom but once this is cut out you will not see this at all, using low tack tape to tape this die down in at least 3 places. Then repeat on the right hand side, then run this through your die cutting machine. Carefully remove the dies from the card and this will give you this piece below. Then add a strip of foam tape onto the back just inside the decorative edges.



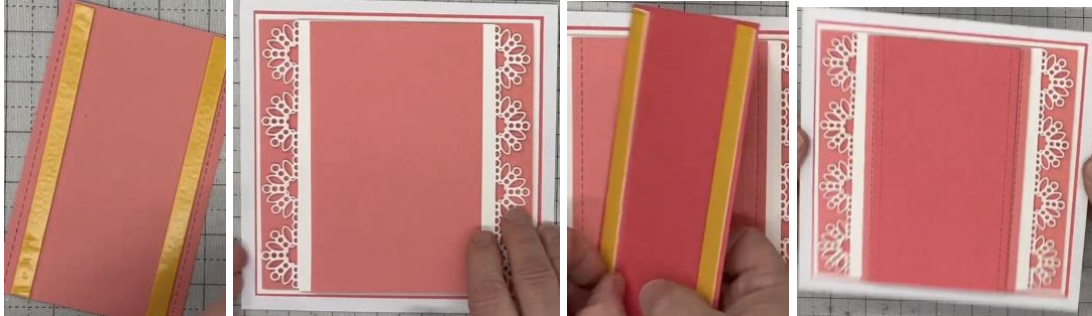
- Then cut a 6" x 6" square of Salmon Pink card and bring in the white piece, remove the yellow backing on the foam tape then add this onto the Salmon Pink card.
- Bring in your 7" x 7" top folding card blank and add a layer of Coconut White card at 6¼" x 6¼" and from a darker Sherbert Pink add another layer which is cut at 6⅜" x 6⅜". You can then add your main piece onto the front of your card.



- John has then measured across the middle white panel which is 4¼" across, so cut another panel of the Salmon Pink card to 3¾" wide x 6" long. What we want to do is to add a bit of detail to this, which is where our side panel strips come in, so place the card evenly onto your mat and take one of the thin stitched dies and place at about ⅛" on from the left and tape the die down in at least 2 places, then repeat on the other end taping that die down as well, then you can run through your die cutting machine. You then have a beautiful row of cut lines down both sides.



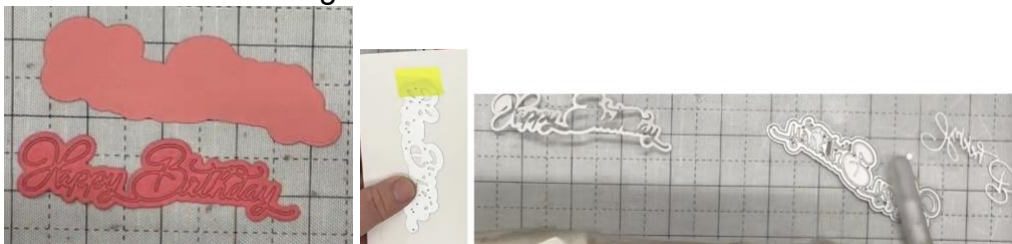
- Turn the panel over and add a strip of foam tape down both ends just inside the stitched detail, remove the backing and add this onto the front of your card. We are then going to do exactly the same again using the darker sherbet pink colour card which this time has been cut to about 3¼" wide x 6" long



- Bring in a piece of coconut white card which is the same depth 6" and I think it is 3½" wide, then run this through your Argyle embossing folder, add a strip of foam tape down the 2 sides, remove the backing and add this onto the front of your card.



- Take the scraps of all 3 colours of the card, and using the Happy Birthday die, cut out the larger background solid die from I think it is the soft pink, then cut middle one from Salmon Pink and finally cut the sentiment out of the darker Pink twice, adhere one on top of another for this sentiment. Then cut the sentiment out again from Coconut White card.



- We then need to layer these up and for speed John is using the 3M Spray Adhesive, then loosely place the sentiment into position over the pink letters. This is the most detailed die John has ever designed; it really is stunning.



- Cut a piece of foam tape roughly the length of the sentiment and using your non-stick scissors cut up the middle so you have 2 pieces, then cut one of these in half, add one bit behind the birthday and the other bit behind the happy, reveal the tape and add this onto your background piece. Add another strip of foam tape onto the back, remove the backing and add this onto the front of your card.



Your creation is now complete. I hope you have enjoyed these instructions.
